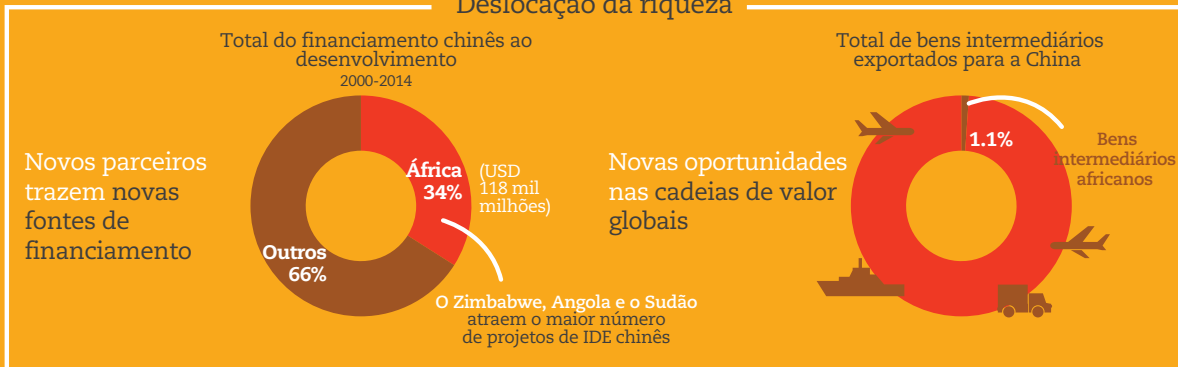

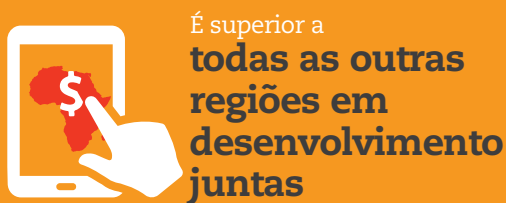

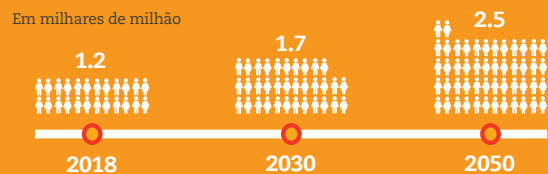
Nova revolução na produção

As cidades com menos de 500 000 residentes representaram 67% do crescimento urbano entre 2000 e 2018

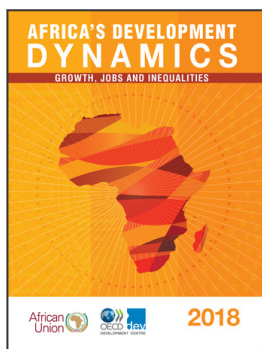


Alterações climáticas
