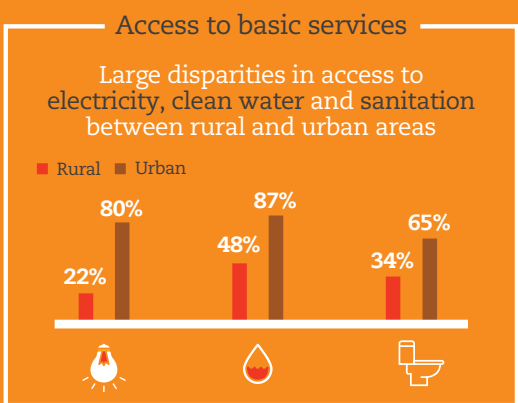
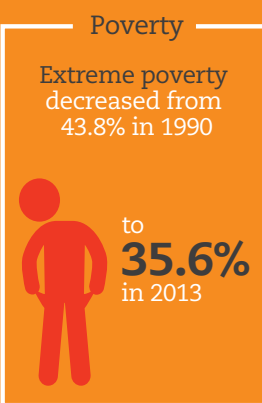
Employment

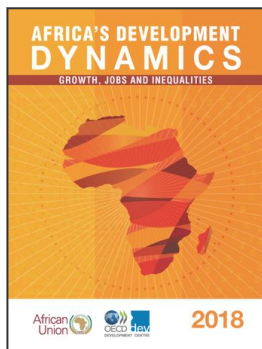
Long-term unemployment rates in SACU countries reach **15-35%** due to limited job creation, a skills mismatch and barriers to entrepreneurship
