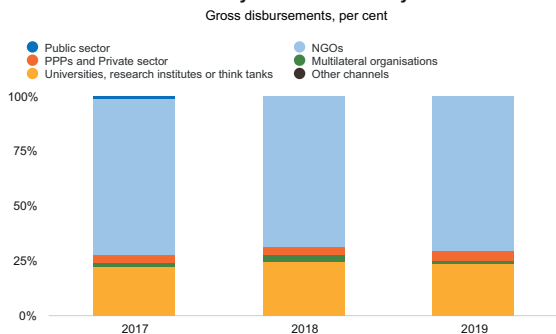

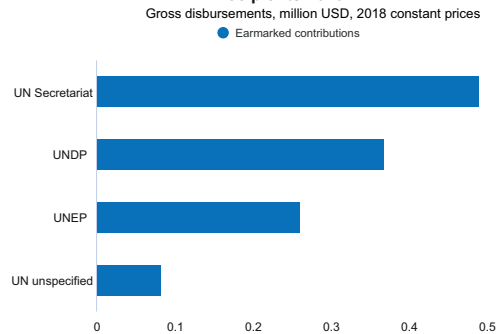

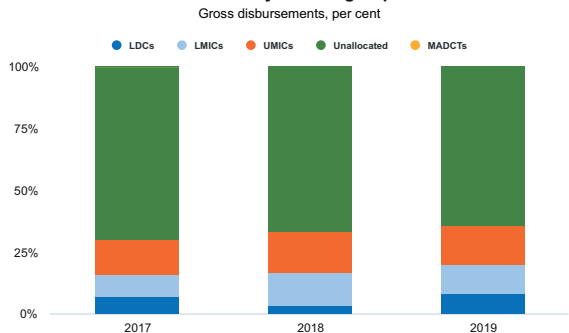
William & Flora Hewlett Foundation - Bilateral private development finance by channel of delivery



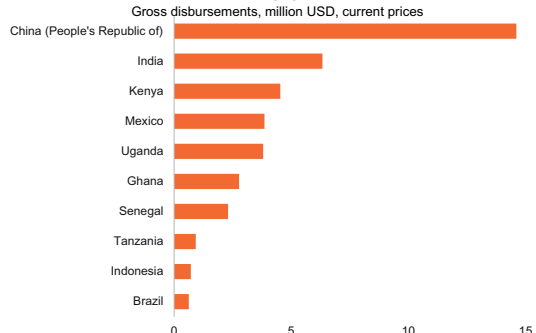
William & Flora Hewlett Foundation - Top 10 United Nations recipients 2019
